IMAPS-UK Committee Member Role Description:

This is a volunteer role fulfilled by a fully paid member of IMAPS-UK, elected as an “Ordinary Committee Member” at the AGM onto the Societies organising Committee, for a period of one year. The elected person must commit to the following responsibilities and report their activities to their fellow officers at the Societies Committee Meetings, which are held 3-4 times per year; travel and subsistence costs of attending the meetings can be re-charged to the Society at the individuals’ discretion.

Overview:
